- CorelDRAW is a **vector graphics design software** used for creating logos, posters, brochures, and illustrations.
-

Q2. What kind of designing can be done using CorelDRAW?

- Logo design
 - Business cards and brochures
 - Posters and flyers
 - Web graphics
 - Vector illustrations
-

Q3. Is CorelDRAW a kind of media?

- No, CorelDRAW is **software**, not a media type.
 - It is used to design different forms of **print and digital media**.
-

Q4. What are uses of Pick Tool?

- Selects, moves, resizes, rotates, and skews objects in CorelDRAW.
-

Q5. What file formats can be imported into CorelDRAW?

- JPG, PNG, GIF, PDF, AI, PSD, BMP, TIFF, SVG.
-

Q6. What is the difference between a Vector and a Raster image?

- **Vector:** Made of paths and shapes, scalable without quality loss.
 - **Raster:** Made of pixels, loses quality when enlarged.
-

Q7. How do you align objects in CorelDRAW?

- Use **Align and Distribute** options (Arrange → Align).
-

Q8. How do you duplicate objects in CorelDRAW?

- Select object → Press **Ctrl + D** → Duplicate is created.
-

Q9. How do you weld or trim objects in CorelDRAW?

- **Weld:** Combines multiple objects into one.
 - **Trim:** Removes overlapping part of an object.
-

Q10. How can you use nodes to reshape an object?

- Convert object to curves → Use **Shape Tool** → Add, delete, or move nodes to reshape.
-

Q11. What are Nodes in CorelDRAW?

- **Points** that define the shape of curves and paths.
-

Q12. How do you access the nodes of an object in CorelDRAW?

- Select object → Click **Shape Tool (F10)** → Nodes appear.
-

Q13. How do you add or delete nodes in CorelDRAW?

- **Add:** Right-click on path → Insert Node.
 - **Delete:** Select node → Press Delete.
-

Q14. How do you move nodes in CorelDRAW?

- Select node with **Shape Tool** → Drag to new position.
-

Q15. What is the Simplify command in CorelDRAW?

- Removes overlapping parts of objects and simplifies shapes.
-

Q16. What are Back Minus Front and Front Minus Back commands in CorelDRAW?

- **Back Minus Front:** Removes overlapping area of back object using front object.
 - **Front Minus Back:** Removes overlapping area of front object using back object.
-

Q17. What is the Smudge Brush Tool in CorelDRAW?

- Pushes or smears the edges of an object to create a distorted effect.
-

Q18. What is the Roughen Brush Tool in CorelDRAW?

- Adds **jagged or rough edges** to objects for textured designs.
-

Q19. What is the Crop Tool in CorelDRAW?

- Used to remove unwanted parts of an object or image.
-

Q20. What are the Knife and Erase Tools in CorelDRAW?

- **Knife Tool:** Cuts objects into two or more parts.
 - **Erase Tool:** Erases parts of objects like a rubber.
-

Q21. What is the Virtual Segment Delete command in CorelDRAW?

- Deletes **specific segments of overlapping objects** without affecting the rest of the shape.
-

Q22. What is the Convert Outline to Object command in CorelDRAW?

- Converts an **outline (stroke)** into a **separate filled shape**.

Q1. What is CorelDRAW, and what are its main features and functions?

- CorelDRAW is a **vector graphics editor**.
 - **Features:**
 1. Shape and drawing tools
 2. Typography tools
 3. Advanced color management
 4. Node editing
 5. Import/export in multiple formats
 6. Effects (transparency, shadows, gradients)
-

Q2. What are the different kinds of designing that can be done with CorelDRAW?

- **Print media:** Logos, posters, business cards.
 - **Digital media:** Web banners, icons, social media posts.
 - **Product design:** Labels, packaging.
 - **Illustrations:** Vector art, technical drawings.
-

Q3. What kinds of media can be used with CorelDRAW?

- **Print media:** Brochures, flyers, books.
 - **Digital media:** Web designs, social graphics.
 - **Advertising media:** Posters, billboards.
 - **Text and images:** Imported for editing and layout.
-

Q4. What is the Pick Tool in CorelDRAW, and how can it be used?

- Used to **select and manipulate** objects.
 - Functions: Move, resize, rotate, skew, and apply transformations.

Q5. How can you reshape objects using Nodes in CorelDRAW?

- Convert to curves → Use Shape Tool → Add, delete, or move nodes.
- Tips: Use fewer nodes for smoother curves, align nodes for symmetry.

Q6. How can you align objects in CorelDRAW?

- Use **Align and Distribute (Ctrl + A → Arrange → Align)**.
 - Align left, right, top, bottom, center horizontally or vertically.

Q7. What is the Duplicate command in CorelDRAW?

- Creates exact copy of an object with **Ctrl + D**.
 - Useful for patterns and repeating designs.
-

Q8. What are Welding and Trimming objects in CorelDRAW?

- **Weld:** Joins objects into one.
 - **Trim:** Cuts away overlapping portions.
-

Q9. How can you Intersect objects in CorelDRAW?

- Select objects → Use **Intersect Tool** → Creates new shape where objects overlap.
-

Q10. What are Back Minus Front and Front Minus Back functions?

- Boolean operations used to **subtract shapes**:
 - **Back Minus Front:** Removes overlapping back object.
 - **Front Minus Back:** Removes overlapping front object.
-

Q11. What is the Smudge Brush Tool in CorelDRAW?

- Drags object edges for **organic, hand-drawn effects**.
-

Q12. What is the Roughen Brush Tool in CorelDRAW?

- Adds irregular outlines for **textured appearance**.
-

Q13. What is the Crop Tool in CorelDRAW?

- Removes unwanted areas of image/object.
-

Q14. What are Knife and Erase Tools?

- **Knife Tool:** Splits object into parts.
 - **Erase Tool:** Deletes portions of objects.
-

Q15. What is the Virtual Segment Delete Tool?

- Deletes only the overlapping **segment of objects**.

Q16. How can you Convert Outline to Object in CorelDRAW?

- Select outline → Arrange → Convert Outline to Object.
 - Useful for custom shapes.
-

Q17. Difference between Copy, Clone, and Duplicate command.

- **Copy (Ctrl + C, Ctrl + V):** Places a copy into clipboard to paste anywhere.
 - **Clone:** Creates linked copy → changes in original reflect in clone.
 - **Duplicate (Ctrl + D):** Creates instant copy, independent of original.
